Apr. 2 TRÉ MOYNIHAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP NOMINATION

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is a varsity student athlete. Student must have a minimum 3.5 GPA, be planning to attend a two- or four-year college, technical or vocational school and have demonstrated commitment to an athletic team in at least one high school sport. Award: \$2,000. Nomination process: Teammates, peers, coaches, DJUSD staff, mentors, community members and friends may nominate a student for this award. Apr. 2 DAVIS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL PTA GRADUATING SENIOR AWARDS

Eligibility: Davis Senior High School senior. The PTA award is not a college scholarship, but an award to recognize student growth during high school. Students must submit a response to an essay question. **Award:** \$500.

Apr. 2 PETERSEN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who participated at least two years in Davis Senior High School's Cross-Country program. Student must have a minimum 2.0 GPA and plan to attend a two- or four-year college or vocational school. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Peterson Application

Apr. 2 **DAVID MURPHY SCHOLARSHIP**

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is an immigrant or son or daughter of an immigrant to the U.S. Student must plan to attend a college or university, have an academic record that meets UC admission criteria (but does not have to attend a UC) and have financial need. Award: \$1,000. Apply: David Murphy Application

Apr. 2 NOVOZYMES, INC. SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who shows promise for scientific achievement, is planning to major in a biological or chemical science, is in good academic standing and is well-rounded. Financial need is not a consideration. Award: \$2,000. Apply: Novozymes Application

Apr. 2 HEATHER CARR WEST MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: **Graduating senior from a high school in Davis** who participated in at least one varsity sport. Student must have a minimum 3.5 GPA.

Apr. 2 JACOB COLE SCHNEIDER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who plans to attend a two- or four-year college, or enroll in a technical training program (such as welding, culinary program, cosmetology, nursing assistant, etc.)

Award: \$1,000 - \$3,000. Apply: Jacob Cole Schneider Application, Jacob Cole Schneider Scholarship Description

Apr. 2 DAVIS SUNRISE ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who plans to attend a community college or vocational school. Awards are based on financial need. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Community Scholarship Application

Apr. 2 DAVIS TEACHERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis. Awards are based on character, leadership, plans for a teaching career and financial need. **Award:** \$500. **Apply:** Community Scholarship Application

Apr. 2 R.L. "DICK" AND MARILYN MANSFIELD SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis. Award will be givn to a student who is planning to pursue a career in education or an education-related field. Student must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, participated in sports during high school, and been involved in community service. Financial need will be considered. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Community Scholarship Application

Apr. 2 <u>TEO VILLANUEVA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u>

Eligibility: Graduating Latino senior from a high school in Davis who is friendly, caring, honest, happy, concerned for others and has financial need. **Award:** \$2,500. **Apply:** Community Scholarship Application

Apr. 2 KIWANIS CLUB OF DAVIS SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Davis Senior High School senior who is a current Key Club member and has been a Key Club member for the equivalent of at least two academic school years. Recipients will be selected based on participation in community and school service activities, academic performance, and financial need. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Community Scholarship Application

Apr. 2 PAUL MAKLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who has a minimum 2.75 GPA, financial need, participated in school related activities, volunteerism in the community and/or workplace teamwork or leadership, and exhibits the qualities of integrity, positive attitude, kindness and generosity. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Paul Makley Application.

Apr. 2 DAVIS BLUE DEVIL ATHLETIC BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP AND DEWEY HALDEN FAMILY TEAM PLAYER AWARD

Eligibility: Graduating seniors from a high school in Davis can apply for two scholarships offered by Davis Blue Devil Athletic Boosters. Blue Devil Athletic Boosters Scholarship is for students who have a minimum 3.2 GPA and played in three seasons of CIF sports Dewey Halden Family Team Player Award is for students who have a minimum 3.0 GPA and played two seasons of CIF sports. Due to COVID 19, intent to participate in any sport between Spring 2020 and Spring 2021 will be accepted. Award: Various amounts. Apply: Davis Blue Devil Athletic Boosters/Dewey Halden Application

Apr. 2 BARBARA NEU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who attended Fairfield Elementary School as a child. Student must submit an essay describing a favorite memory at Fairfield Elementary, and describe your personal goals. **Award:** \$3,330. **Apply:** Barbara Neu Application.

Apr. 2 BARBARA HUBBARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is planning to attend a two- or four-year college. Students must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and have participated in at least one of the following: community or volunteer service; school related or extracurricular activities; employment; or sports. Financial need will be considered. Special consideration will be given to students pursuing a major or career in teaching or an education-related field. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Barbara Hubbard Application.

Apr. 2 ARMSTRONG FAMILY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is planning to attend a two- or four-year college or university in the fall and whose career goal and educational plans will be education or education-related. Financial need is not a consideration. Students are not required to be U.S. citizens. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Armstrong Education Application.

Apr. 2 **PROJECT PINK SCHOLARSHIP**

Eligibility: Davis Senior High School seniors. Students must submit an essay describing how you have overcome adversity or helped someone else overcome adversity. **Award:** \$500. **Apply:** Project Pink Application.

Apr. 2 KATIE SALLEE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who attended Davis Parent Nursery School (DPNS) for at least one year as a child, or is planning a career in Early Childhood Education. Student must submit an essay on the value of Early Childhood Education, either from your personal experience at DPNS or your plans for a career in the field. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Katie Sallee Application.

Apr. 2 SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF DAVIS DREAM IT BE IT HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating female seniors from a high school in Davis. Student must have at least one female role model, personal values that align with the Soroptimist mission to help women and girls live their dreams, and has solved a problem or overcome an obstacle to reach her dream of attending college. Award: \$2,000 Apply: Soroptimist Application

Apr. 2 AARON ARONSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Davis Senior High School senior who has an overall GPA of 2.0, proven involvement in community service, and the intent to pursue course work that will lead to helping preserve the environment or protecting human rights. **Award:** \$1,000. **Apply:** Agron Aronson Application

Apr. 2 <u>CALIFORNIA SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION (CSEA) CHAPTER</u> 572 SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis whose parent or legal guardian is a dues paying member of the California School Employees Association (CSEA) Chapter 572 (local Davis chapter). Student must have a minimum 2.0 GPA and plan to attend a two- or four-year college or vocational school. Award: \$500. Apply: CSEA Application

Apr. 2 BOB DUNNING JOURNALISM SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in the Davis Joint Unified School District who plans to attend a two- or four-year college or university and is considering a career in journalism. Students must submit one example of their journalistic work and an essay responding to one of three journalism related questions. Award: \$1,000. Apply: Bob Dunning Application

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is planning to
pursue a career in law enforcement at a two- or four-year college or

Apr. 6 <u>BEEGHLY-MERRITT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u>

Eligibility: Davis and Woodland high school seniors who plan to attend UC Davis. Applicants must be accepted and/or registered to enter UC Davis within three years of their high school graduation. Students must have a minimum 3.5 GPA and had significant employment during high school, which resulted in the earning and saving of a meaningful amount of income. Award: \$15,060. Apply: Beeghly-Merritt Application. Note: Students who are waitlisted at UCD are not eligible for this scholarship.

Apr. 28 <u>LILY NISEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u>

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who is planning to attend a college, technical or vocational school, and has played with Davis AYSO in the U14 or older division(s). Financial need will be an important consideration. Award: \$1,500. Apply: Lily Nisen Application.

Apr. 30 DAVIS CHINESE ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: Davis Senior High School seniors of Chinese descent who have demonstrated achievements in academics and extracurricular activities. An essay must be submitted describing how your life has been influenced by growing up as a Chinese American in the United States. Award: Various amounts. Apply: Davis Chinese Association Application

TOP TEN SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION TIPS

1. GIVE CONCRETE EXAMPLES WHEN ANSWERING AN ESSAY QUESTION

If your answer to an essay question is abstract, support it with a concrete example that illustrates your point. The sponsor wants to see evidence that you satisfy their criteria, not just unsupported statements.

2. APPLY ONLY IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE

Read all eligibility requirements and directions carefully. Your application will not be considered if you aren't qualified to apply.

3, IDENTIFY THE SPONSOR'S GOALS

Try to understand the sponsor's motivation in offering the award. Are they promoting interest in their field? Do they want to identify future researchers and business leaders? Identifying their goals can direct your application toward satisfying those goals, increasing your chances of winning the award.

4. COMPLETE THE APPLICATION IN FULL AND FOLLOW DIRECTIONS

Give yourself a competitive advantage by following directions carefully. Provide everything required, but don't supply things not requested. Complete the entire application. If a question doesn't apply, note that on the application rather than leaving it blank.

5. NEATNESS COUNTS

Make several photocopies of all the application forms to use as working drafts as you develop your application packet. It is always best to type the application. If you must print, do so neatly and legibly. Proofread the entire application carefully. Nothing is less impressive than an application with misspelled words or grammar errors. Ask a friend, teacher or parent to proofread it as well.

6. WRITE AN ACCOMPLISHMENTS RESUME

Compile a list of all your accomplishments. This will help you identify your strengths and prepare a better application. Give a copy of the resume to the people writing letters of recommendation for you. It will help them know you better.

7. WATCH ALL DEADLINES

Impose a deadline for yourself that's at least two weeks before the application deadline. Use this time to proofread your application. You are responsible for making sure the application arrives on time. This includes supporting materials, such as letters of recommendation and transcripts. Give contributors to your application ample lead-time.

8. MAKE SURE YOUR APPLICATION GETS WHERE IT NEEDS TO GO

Before sending, make a copy of the entire application packet for your file. Make sure your name appears on all pages of the application. Pieces of your application may get lost unless the pages are clearly identified.

9. ASK FOR HELP IF YOU NEED IT

If you have problems with the application, call the sponsor. They will be glad to help. But don't expect them to do the work for you. Completing the application is your job.

10. YOUR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION REPRESENTS YOU

Your ability to submit a neat, timely, complete application reflects on you. It's the face you present to the sponsoring organization. Take pride by submitting the best application you can.
